Northport girls' basketball playoff preview

No such thing as a free first round

Castellano: We'd rather be playing because we don't want to lose edge

As it prepared to make a run for a second straight Long Island championship, the Northport girls' basketball team had to wait around a little longer than everyone else. Thanks to a perfect regular-season record, the Lady Tigers earned a bye in the first round, much to the delight of head coach Rich Castellano, right?

Wrong, said the 25th-year head coach. "East Islip could have been the No. 16 seed at 6-6 if they had beaten West-Islip [in the regular-season finale February 12]. Then we wouldn't have gotten a bye," Castellano said. "We didn't want a bye because we don't want to lose the edge."



In the meantime, Northport senior forward Ali Fourney got a chance to rest the partially torn ligament in her left knee, which has been bothering her since she returned to action January 18 against Walt Whitman. Even when Fourney came out of the game noticeably limping on her left knee against Sachem North in the regular-season finale, Castellano was a little wary of putting her back in the game. That is when Fourney's motivation began to show, according to Castellano. "She talked me into going in," Castellano said of the 6-0 forward, who has com-


